Gandhinagar- 382721, Gujarat (AYU0368) for increase intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 60 to 100 seats and to start 05 PG courses with 25 seats in the subject namely (i) Kayachikitsa (05 seats) (ii) Shalya Tantra (05 seats) (iii) Prasuti & Stri Roga- (05 seats) (iv) Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan (05 seats) and (v) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhant (05 seats) under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 from the academic session 2022-23 and relevant regulation thereunder- regarding.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act,1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made thereunder shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made thereunder. Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM ACT 2020 shall not be applicable.

1. I am to refer to your application vide ref no. SSAC/Letter of Permission/BAMS SS POC/20-21/1655 dated 30.10.2021 on the subject cited above and to verify the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff and other facilities available at your college namely **Shree Swaminarayan Ayurvedic College, Opp. Kalol G.I.D.C. National Highway No. 8, At & Post-Saij, Ta.-Kalol, Distt. Gandhinagar- 382721, Gujarat (AYU0368) for increase intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 60 to 100 seats and to start 05 PG courses with 25 seats in the subject namely (i) Kayachikitsa (05 seats) (ii) Shalya Tantra (05 seats) (iii) Prasuti & Stri Roga- (05 seats) (iv) Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan (05 seats) and (v) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhant (05 seats) under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 from the academic session 2022-23, the college has been visited for issuance of Letter of Intent (LOI) on 09.06.2022 & 10.06.2022 in Hybrid mode by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) and Letter of Intent (LOI) has been issued to your college vide letter of even no. dated 10.10.2022 for increase intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 60 to 100 seats and 05 PG courses with 25 seats in the subjects namely (i) Kayachikitsa (05 seats) (ii) Shalya Tantra (05 seats) (iii) Prasuti & Stri Roga- (05 seats) (iv) Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan (05 seats) and (v) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhant (05 seats) under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 from the academic session 2022-23 and relevant regulations thereunder.**
2. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) had carried out an inspection of the institution again on 22.11.2022 and 23.11.2022 through Hybrid mode to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, Hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities available as a part of **annual visitation for issuance of conditional permission** for intake capacity with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and **Letter of Permission** for increase intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 60 to 100 seats and to start **05 PG courses with 25 seats in the subject namely (i) Kayachikitsa (05 seats) (ii) Shalya Tantra (05 seats) (iii) Prasuti & Stri Roga- (05 seats) (iv) Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan (05 seats) and (v) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhant (05 seats)** under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 from the academic session 2022-23.
3. Further, in view of above assessment report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely "the Establishment of New Medical College, Opening of New or Higher Course of Study or Training and Increase of Admission Capacity by a Medical College Regulations, 2019", the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for post-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016 provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under, visitor's report and on the basis of Relaxation policy issued by the NCISM dated 16.03.2022 and as per the direction of **President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM)**, the assessment report and all other related documents were placed in the 22th Board Meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) dated 06.12.2022. Board verified the same and found that college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for **Grant of conditional Permission for intake capacity with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2022-23 and issuance Letter of permission for increase intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 60 to 100 seats and to start 05 PG courses with 25 seats in the subject namely (i) Kayachikitsa (05 seats) (ii) Shalya Tantra (05 seats) (iii) Prasuti & Stri Roga- (05 seats) (iv) Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan (05 seats) and (v) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhant (05 seats)** under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 from the academic session 2022-23.
4. In accordance of 6 (3) (j) (ii) & 6 (2) (i) (i) of "Establishment of New Medical College, Opening of New or Higher Course of Study or Training and Increase of Admission Capacity by a Medical College Regulations, 2019, Vide commission letter

of even no dated 16.12.2022 letter was sent to the college to furnish Fixed security deposit worth rupees 50 Lakh for increase seat in favour of National Commission fund for Indian System of Medicine for the period of Five years and Rs. 02 Crore 50 Lakhs to start 05 PG courses with 25 seats for the period of three years, in response of the same college has transferred the asked amount for the fixed security deposit in favour of the National Commission fund for the Indian system of Medicine through online RTGS vide UTR no. **IBKLR92022121600093004 & IBKLR92022121600092965** dated 16.12.2022 of rupee 50 Lakh (Fifty Lakh) for increase seats and Rs. 02 Crore 50 Lakhs (Two Crore and Fifty Lakhs) to start 05 PG courses with 25 seats transferred by the IDBI Bank (for a period of five years for increase intake with 60 to 100 seats and for a period of three years for 05 PG courses with 25 seats) and informed the same e-mail dated 16.12.2022.

5. Therefore, it has been decided by the president, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) to **Grant of conditional Permission for intake capacity with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2022-23 and issuance Letter of permission for increase intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 60 to 100 seats and to start 05 PG courses with 25 seats in the subject namely (i) Kayachikitsa (05 seats) (ii) Shalya Tantra (05 seats) (iii) Prasuti & Stri Roga- (05 seats) (iv) Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan (05 seats) and (v) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhant (05 seats) under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2022-23** and relevant regulations thereunder, subject to the following conditions:-
- The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
 - It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of **100 UG (BAMS) seats and 25 PG seats** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2022-23 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
 - It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
5. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
6. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
7. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2022 to get permission for the session 2023-24:
- all the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
 - all the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for Post-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
 - all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
 - all the requirements, under the provisions of the NCISM Act-2020 and relevant Regulations, made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto;
8. This Permission for increase intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) course from 60 to 100 seats and 05 PG courses with 25 seats in the subject namely (i) Kayachikitsa (05 seats) (ii) Shalya Tantra (05 seats) (iii) Prasuti & Stri Roga- (05 seats) (iv) Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan (05 seats) and (v) Ayurved Samhita & Siddhant (05 seats) as stated above for the 1st admitted batch of 2022-23 session, will be valid till such time as the first batch of students admitted against these courses appear for the first final examination of the said courses and at that time, the college authorities may take up the matter for recognition of the qualifications under section 35 of the NCISM Act,2020 .
9. The college administration may take up the matter for recognition of the qualification under section 35 of the NCISM act 2020 at that time when the first batch of students admitted against this course appears for the first final professional examination of the said course.
